1. Do you qualify for the federal government's Affordable Connectivity Program (ACP)? <https://www.affordableconnectivity.gov/do-i-qualify>

To show eligibility, you will need to provide income verification such as a copy of your tax return or 3 consecutive pay stubs or a card, letter or other official document as proof of participation in a qualifying program.

Is this a scam?

No! The Affordability Connectivity Program ([ACP](#)) is a federal government plan created by the Federal Communications Commission (FCC) that provides up to \$30 per month to help eligible households pay for high-speed internet service.

How much can the ACP help me?

For eligible households, the ACP will pay up to \$30 per month to help you pay for high-speed Internet (broadband) service in your home.

Can I choose which Internet provider to use?

Yes! All the major internet service providers (ISPs) participate. [Many ISPs](#) offer high-speed internet plans that cost no more than \$30 per month. As a result, home Internet service could be free to you. Comcast (Xfinity) and Verizon (Fios) are the primary providers in Loudoun County that currently offer “high speed” service (100 Mbps download speeds) at no cost for successful ACP applicants.

What if I don't have a computer?

You can apply on any mobile device by scanning the QR code. If your application is successful, you can receive a one-time discount of up to \$100 to purchase a laptop, desktop computer, or tablet from certain participating providers, with a small copay. What information do I have to share to apply?

The application process requires you to provide the following information:

1. Your name, address and phone number
2. The last four digits of your Social Security Number if you have one
3. A scanned copy or photo of a government-issued proof of identity, like a driver's license or passport
4. A scanned copy of documents proving your participation in a qualifying government assistance program

OR

A scanned copy or photo of one of the following: your prior year's federal tax return, a Social Security, Unemployment or Workers Compensation benefit statement, a current income statement from an employer or paycheck stub, a Divorce Decree, child support award, or other official document containing income information. You may be able to avoid income documentation **if you apply online** and provide the last four digits of your Social Security Number.

5. If you apply online, you will also be asked to create a username and a password. This will allow you to return later to complete the application process if you need to do so.
